- 2. If you moved away to a very different country, what would you like to be sent to remind you of home?
- 3. Discuss their favourite clothing how important is what you wear? How does it reflect your personality/sense of identity?
- 4. Read poem.
- 5. Make a list of the contrasts:

- 6. What do you notice about the differences between the things described or mentioned about each culture? Look at the different ways they are described too. Which seems more attractive? Why?
- 7. Which does the girl seem more at home with? Why? Pick out some lines where her feelings seem particularly mixed.
- 8. How is the girls' isolation/separation from both these cultures suggested?
- 9. What are the images or objects associated with your past/your present? What have you kept to remind you of your childhood? What have you been told about your childhood that you don't remember yourself?
- 10. Play the "empty room" game. Imagine that as a trick your friend empty your room completely leaving only 5 objects to represent you as a person (It happened to a friend of JMG's at university!) What would they choose and/or what would you like them to choose? What do these objects say about you? Write anonymous lists and guess who's who.
- 11. Do some imaginative writing or an oral from the point of view of a person who has moved to a place where they feel they don't belong OR someone who's not sure where home really is for some reason
 - OR some personal writing or poetry about some of the issues about identity and memories raised above.
- 12. Poems to compare other poems where 2 cultures are contrasted or combined Hurricane, Half-caste, Search for my Tongue. Outsiders within a culture cf Nothing's Changed.
