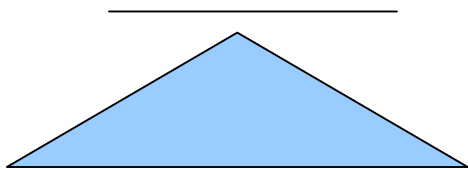

(iii) Cesario/Viola, sent by Duke Orsino, has been waiting for an audience with Olivia and has rudely refused to leave her gates until he meets with her in person. Malvolio describes Cesario as being somewhere between man and boy. He is not aware as is the audience, of Cesario’s true identity which adds humour to the situation on stage. Malvolio is the unwitting dupe or victim of a joke however this time its intended for the audience only.

(iii) Sir Toby is speaking to Sir Andrew about Maria. He is making suggestive statements to Sir Andrew about Maria. Sir Andrew’s naivety causes him to misprison the comments and Sir Toby is happy to clarify his pun. Accost doesn’t mean to greet Maria but has sexual connotations.

(iii) Curio has asked his lord, Duke Orsino if he plans to hunt the hart. Shakespeare uses the word hart (stag) as a pun to mean his heart. Orsino, with his pun, makes reference to the mythological figure Acteon, who having gazed in secret at the naked body of the chaste goddess Diana, is turned into a hart, pursued by his own hounds and torn to shreds. Orsino believes that his heart/hart is to be devoured by fates fierce and cruel hounds.
